MMEL ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You can apply to do your MMEL at WBS if:

- You have a first degree and postgraduate (NQF 8) qualification.
In certain cases, recognition of prior learning may be granted.
- You have a level of above average competence in Mathematics and English.
- You have three to five years' appropriate work experience. To be exempted from this requirement a letter of motivation must accompany the application.

Candidates may also be required to attend an interview with WBS.

Those short-listed may be required to complete admissions tests at their own cost.

CLASS OPTIONS/STUDY FORMATS

PART-TIME (18-24 MONTHS)

JANUARY INTAKE

Study Mode: Block Release

Teaching is provided on a block release basis to accommodate the needs of busy working professionals (four blocks of nine days on campus plus home study or online if circumstances require).

The programme is expected to be completed between one year and 18 months (or a maximum of 24 months), including completion of the research report.

MMEL CURRICULUM



The programme will provide you with a solid foundation, latest thinking and best practice in energy leadership.

The MMEL curriculum comprises two parts: eleven core courses and one elective (120 credits), and a research report (60 credits).

1. CORE COURSES

The MMEL consists of the following core courses:

1. Energy Value Chains
2. Energy Geography, Geopolitics and Macroeconomics
3. Strategic Management of Energy Innovation
4. Energy and Environmental Sustainability
5. Ethics and Corporate Governance
6. Energy, Finance, Business Strategy and Investment
7. Energy Policy and Economic Regulation
8. Systems Thinking and Complexity
9. Leadership Quest for MM
10. Strategic Talent Management in Energy Environments
11. Research Methodology

2. ELECTIVES

A candidate shall elect any one of the following electives:

- Futures in Energy
- Leadership
- Energy Entrepreneurship and Enterprise Development in Africa
- Energy Market Structures
- Decarbonising Energy
- Energy in Future Cities

3. RESEARCH REPORT

This is not a taught course, but the independent study portion of the curriculum. A prerequisite for the course is attendance at the Research Methodology course. Candidates must undertake academic – usually empirical – research and produce a mini-thesis.



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The high-impact case studies and expert faculty delivered the strategic insights I needed to deepen my understanding of Africa’s unique energy challenges and sustainability opportunities.
